From the Desk of Fr. Angelo

As we approach Great Lent, I think this is an appropriate time to recall what Christ and the Apostles have commanded us to do with regards to our Christian responsibilities toward others. In an article written by Army Chaplin Capt. Michael Fox, he highlights four distinct responsibilities.

First, we have a Christian duty to pray for each other. The Apostle James tells us, "Therefore confess your sins to each other and pray for each other so that you may be healed. The prayer of a righteous man is powerful and effective." (James 5:16) In today's environment, we tend to respond to problems and issues in a dynamic way. Just do something! In our Orthodox Tradition, prayer is the first of those dynamic actions. Both the worldly response πραξις (action) and spiritual προσευχη (prayer) are the natural Orthodox response. We must pray for each other. Christians must intercede for our brothers and sisters and pray on their behalf. This is realized in our parish through personal prayer at home with our families and communal prayer at the Divine Liturgy.

Second, we have a Christian duty to serve each other. The Apostle Peter tells us, "Each one should use whatever gift he has received to serve others, faithfully administering God's grace in its various forms." (1 Peter 4:10) It is in our service that all will see God's grace in action as we demonstrate our faith. Service demonstrates Christian love toward others. This is realized in our parish through the many outreach activities I have been part of. The people of our parish have offered the "gift" of clothing and other needed items to help those less fortunate in our local community. With our newly formed Outreach Ministry, we will also offer our "gift of service" through volunteerism. The mission of this outreach team is to empower all the ministries within our church by providing support, guidance and collaboration and to be the face of our church to the local Rochester community. In addition to this, I have asked the Outreach Committee to develop a bank of volunteer opportunities from where we can select our personal interests.

Third, we have a Christian duty to encourage one another. St Paul tells us, "Encourage one another and build each other up." (1 Thessalonians 5:11) In today's stressful world it is easy to become discouraged because of work, relationships, finances, or larger issues occurring in the world. It is through encouragement that people can rise up and be prepared to deal with any obstacle they may encounter when they are reminded to not only believe in themselves but also to recognize the source of our strength – our Lord and Savior. This is realized in our parish through our time at coffee hour when we "check-in" with one another, making coffee hour an important and valuable ministry. This is where we can offer help to those in need of encouragement (or maybe it's where we receive that encouragement). This is why I strongly reject those



who say "I just want to attend Liturgy and leave" as this attitude rejects this area of our Christian responsibility to be available to "encourage one another".

Fourth, we have a Christian duty to help carry burdens for others. Again, St. Paul tells us, "Carry each other's burdens, and in this way, you will fulfill the law of Christ." (Galatians 6:2) None of us should have to walk alone in this life. We have seen too many times how this leads into depression and too many times suicide when things just seem insurmountable. When we routinely "check-in" with one another, we open ourselves to recognize those who are carrying a heavy burden and we can offer to walk with them in love and share in that burden with Christ. "Come to me, all of you who are weary and carry heavy burdens, and I will give you rest." (Matthew 11:28)

To whom much is given, much is required. As Christians, these are our responsibilities toward one other. Great Lent is when the Church compels us to become introspective, so let us examine ourselves according to these four commandments.

Thank you for your financial support in 2018! I've highlighted some key points for the past year below.

Account Balances

Our checking account balances as of early January 2019 were as follows:

Estate Plans

Two parishioners graciously provided for our Community in their estate plans. The total financial benefit to our Church from these generous contributions was \$150,000. The Parish Council together with Fr Angelo would like to direct these funds toward the Community Center renovation project. As of this date, \$100,000 has been transferred to the Build Improvement account.

<u>Stewardshi</u>p

Stewardship contributions were roughly level as compared to 2017. We'll have a more detailed accounting as we fully close out 2018 in the next couple weeks. To ensure that we obtain a reliable baseline going forward, Father Angelo is asking all parishioners to fill out a Stewardship pledge card for 2019 that was included in the year-end packet that was mailed to you. Our part time secretary, Lena Livecchi, is working diligently to organize all our contact and pledge information into our Parish Stewardship software package. This will help Father Angelo to better identify our parishioners as he and the Parish Council President continue to reach out to both members and those who have fallen away.

Financial Update and Report continued

Expenses

We experienced an uptick in expenses from the period July-Sep 2018 as we carried the expenses of two priests; Fr Catlin Mot's 4 month reimbursement for Sabbatical which each priest is afforded after 6 years of continuous service in a parish and Fr Angelo's salary. We also added Lena Livechhi our part time Secretary who staffs the office M-F from 10am – 3pm. Moving forward, we will see <u>base</u> operating expenses level out at roughly \$405,000 annually or \$33,750 per month.

Restricted Accounts

Over the years our church has been the beneficiary of certain restricted donations. Most of these donations have specific designations for use of the interest generated from the donation. Unfortunately many of these investments are static and generate very little interest and in some cases the original benefactor has passed away. The Parish Council has asked Alan Makovsky and I to reach out to these families who have ties to the original benefactor and determine if a more beneficial use of the funds is appropriate, which could include facility improvements, scholarships for our youth, or various outreach initiatives.




2018 LOCAL AHEPA CHAPTER AWARDS \$5,500 IN SCHOLARSHIPS


All monies received during a funeral or memorial service that are made out to the church, that is, checks marked with "Annunciation Greek Orthodox Church" or cash with the envelope marked with "Annunciation Greek Orthodox Church" will be used for purposes in support of church operation.

These could include support of recognized church ministries, sacramental articles purchased for the church proper or for ongoing campaigns such as Hall Renovation or other capita improvements.

If it is desired that these monies are to be used for other wishes that the family may have the family must ensure that they announce that theses checks or cash be designated as such.

The Church secretary tracks all monies received for funerals and will provide the surviving family members a listing of those who donated and a total amount of the donation, typically within 40-60 days following the date of the funeral. In addition, for all monies received as designated "Annunciation Greek Orthodox Church" the Church secretary will send each donor a letter thanking them for their donation to the church in memory of the deceased.
