From the Desk of Fr. Angelo

The Road Ahead

Unfortunately, this year has begun with sadness in light of the loss of several parishioners in December and January. This suffering, while real and personal, is a reminder of the tragic sufferings of the early Christian communities. In St. Paul's letters, you quickly grasp the difficulties of the situation that he, and his bishops, faced as most Christian communities struggled with their faith and paid with their lives in tragic and horrible suffering. Often times, they were unsure of whether to continue their beliefs in the pagan gods of Olympus or Rome or continue to believe in this Christ of whom St. Paul was preaching about. Their faith was being tested through doubt, mockings, verbal and physical sufferings. In his advice to the Corinthians, St. Paul speaks about these difficulties and where God is in the midst of our suffering:

"Every trial that you have experienced is the kind that normally comes to people. But God keeps His promise, and He will not allow you to be tried beyond your power to remain firm: at the time of your trial He will give you the strength to endure it, and so provide you with a way out." (1 Cor 10:13)

As you have heard me say many times in my sermons: We will all experience suffering in our lives, and that suffering will take on a different form for each person. However, we must always be vigilant to remember that it is God who is in control and He does not allow us to be tested beyond our means – even though we may feel overwhelmed by the events of the time. In the sadness of knowing that suffering, both spiritual and physical, is inevitable, the good news is that God will give us the strength to endure it.

"Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of compassion and the God of all comfort, who comforts us in all our troubles, so that we can comfort those in any trouble with the comfort we ourselves receive from God. For just as we share abundantly in the sufferings of Christ, so also our comfort abounds through Christ." (2 Cor 3-5)

While we all feel despair in these difficult times, it is here when we are most vulnerable and must be vigilant to the attacks of Satan and his forces. The Hebrew Scriptures is replete with the sufferings of God's people: The lives of Job, King David and Hosea give us an example of hope in hopeless times – of firmness in faith at a time when God seemed far away. Job cried out to God showing us that there is no shame in feeling hurt, pain or suffering...but the story is also one of hope in that we see God answer Job and restore to him all that he had lost. Adversity and suffering was a pattern in David's life, yet he trusted in God:

"Before I was afflicted [suffered] I went astray: but now have I kept Your word" (Psalm 119:67).

In the same way the Book of Hosea offers the same message. This is a wonderful love story from a mortal

sense (Hosea and Gomer) and a divine sense (God and Israel) and demonstrates the long-suffering love (Numbers 14:18) God has for His people.

St. Paul, in his 2nd letter to the Corinthians, tells us that even though we suffer and struggle, as did the prophets, we have our hope and help in the Holy Trinity. The source of everything is God the Father, proceeding through God the Son, and perfected in God the Holy Spirit. God, who became man, the Christ was perfect man and knows personally the agony of suffering and torment. Knowing this, St. Paul tells us to take comfort that as God's own beloved creation we always have His Grace.

But we have this treasure in jars of clay to show that this all-surpassing power is from God and not from us. We are hard pressed on every side, but not crushed; perplexed, but not in despair; persecuted, but not abandoned; struck down, but not destroyed...For we who are alive are always being given over to death for Jesus' sake, so that His life may be revealed in our mortal body.

(2 Cor 4:7)

In the coming year, we will continue to face significant challenges: financial, spiritual, personal and with those challenges will come suffering, however, we the people of the One True God, protected by His love and wisdom, have been granted the Grace of the Holy Spirit (the Comforter) to strengthen us to endure the hardships we will face (John 14:25).

Through Christ, I am confident that our Annunciation family will continue to meet these challenges in a manner befitting the legacy and determination of our forebearers. This year I pray that each of you consider the awesome responsibility of this legacy of love and reach out to those who have suffered or are experiencing suffering and in grace and love offer them a word or act of comfort.

My favorite priest-professor at Holy Cross Seminary would say that the only thing we have that we can truly give to God is our suffering so let us allow ourselves to be at peace and permit His Grace to flow into your heart.

My comfort in my suffering is this, Your promise preserves my life...I have sought your face with all my heart; be gracious to me according to your promise. (Psalm 119:50, 58)



Dr. John Fotopoulos is an Associate Professor in the Department of Religious Studies at Saint Mary's College, Notre Dame, Indiana where he has served on the faculty since 2001. He graduated as valedictorian with a B.A. in Pre-Theology from Hellenic College and again as valedictorian with a M.Div. from Holy Cross Greek Orthodax School of Theology. Fotopoulos received his Ph.D. from Loyola University Chicago. His area of specialization is the New Testament and Early Christian Literature within the context of Greco-Roman society and culture, focusing on the Letters of St. Paul the Apostle. Fotopoulos also does scholarly work on the historical Jesus and on St. John Chrysostom. Fotopoulos is a member of the prestigious Colloquium Oecumenicum Paulinum which is a select group of international New Testament scholars that meets biennially in Rome to discuss aspects of St. Paul's letters. Dr. Fotopoulos has published four academic books, numerous articles in academic journats and reference works. He also is an Archon of the Order of St. Andrew the Apostle and was honored with

the offikion ("office") Διδάσκαλος του Εύαγχελίου ("Teacher of the Gospet") by His All-Holiness Ecumenical Patriarch Bartholomew of Constantinople. Fotopoulos is married to Dr. Eleni Makris and they have two children.

These could include support of recognized church ministries, sacramental articles purchased for the church proper or for ongoing campaigns such as Hall Renovation or other capita improvements.

If it is desired that these monies are to be used for other wishes that the family may have the family must ensure that they announce that theses checks or cash be designated as such.

All monies received for funerals are tracked, and family members will receive a listing of those who donated and a total amount of the donation, typically within 40-60 days following the date of the funeral. In addition, for all monies received designated "*Annunciation Greek* Orthodox Church," donors will receive a letter thanking them for their donation to the church in memory of the deceased.

POLICY FOR DOCUMENT PREPARATION:

There is a required processing charge of \$40 per document. This charge covers research, preparation and routing of documents such as Certificate of Residency, Certificate of Freedom to Marry, Reissued Marriage Certificate, Reissued Baptism Certificate and Certificate of Death. Additional documents are \$20.00 per document.

ADDITIONAL:

We have wedding candles in the office for purchase which is required at the time of the ceremony. The donation for them are \$30.00.

We also have baptismal candles, \$30 for the large candles and \$7 each for the two (2) smaller candles which are also required at the time of the baptism.

MEMORIALS:

Coffee Hour scheduling for family memorials is the responsibility of the Philoptochos unless other arrangements have been made by the family sponsoring the Memorial. The family which is sponsoring the Memorial is asked to :

- Pastor Mike Mullin, Youth Pastor at Asbury First Methodist, Rochester


